

CONNECT

Welcome kids and spend time engaging in conversation and catching up. Get ready to experience today's story.

Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Pray for the kids who typically feel like they know everything already and those for whom learning and school come naturally. Ask God to give them attitudes of willingness to learn. Pray that kids would leave today having learned something new about God and that they would understand there's always more to discover about God and about life itself.

1. EARLY ARRIVER IDEA

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container

- Invite kids to place their offerings in the container.
- Ask: If you could go anywhere for a vacation, where would you go? Why? How would you get there?

2. A SURPRISING JOURNEY

WHAT YOU NEED: Chairs (optional)

WHAT YOU DO:

- Lead the kids on a pretend bus ride.
 - To begin, guide the kids to sit in rows of two—one row behind another. (The kids can sit on the floor or in chairs.)
 - As you travel, pretend to see and hear a variety of surprising things.
 - Provide plenty of prompting in your conversation, but allow the kids to share what they imagine, too.
 - A portion of a sample journey is provided below.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Good morning! Welcome aboard [your church or ministry's name] Bus 252. Today we're traveling from [your town] to [faraway location]. As we begin our journey, you can look to your left where you'll see (*describe a scene appropriate for the location you described*). Oh wow! Is that a (*describe something surprising, such as a purple polka-dotted elephant*)? Who would have thought that we would see THAT?

(Continue the conversation for the remainder of the ride, guiding kids to lean back as you go up hills and over bridges, lean left and right as you go around turns, and quickly lean forward as you suddenly stop for a giant herd of bunnies crossing the road!)

"Wow! That trip was fun. We pretended to see some pretty surprising things, didn't we? [Transition] In Large Group we'll hear about two men who saw and heard some AMAZING things while they were on a journey! Let's go to Large Group to learn more."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

BASIC TRUTH

I need to make the wise choice.

- If you can make the path go from your environment into a hallway or another room, that's great!
- Place the "Discover More about Jesus" pages randomly throughout the path.
- Designate one end of your path as "Jerusalem" and the other as "Emmaus."
- Guide kids to get into pairs and line up at "Jerusalem."
- Lead the first pair to roll the die and move the appropriate number of spaces.
- If they land on a "Discover More About Jesus" space, lead them to pull a "More" card from the Bible.
 - Read the card aloud and quickly paraphrase what the verse is saying about Jesus.
- Keep a quick pace, with pairs taking turns rolling the die and moving the spaces, one pair right after the other.
- When all the kids reach "Emmaus," lead them to run back to Jerusalem in excitement.
- Guide them to echo you as you call out, "Jesus is the Savior of the world!"

WHAT YOU SAY:

"In our Bible story today, the two Jesus followers walking on the road were confused that Jesus had died. They didn't understand that God's plan was for Jesus to die and come back to life so that He could be the Savior of the world. Even though they had spent time with Jesus, they still had more to discover about God's Big Story!

"In fact, that's the one thing to remember today: **There's always more to discover about God's plan.** It was true for the Jesus' followers on the road to Emmaus, and it's true for us today. There's always more to discover and learn at school. There's always more to discover about the world that God made. And **there's always more to discover about God's plan!**"

BOTTOM LINE

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WHAT YOU DO:

- Lead kids in a mashup of trivia and Bingo!
- Give each child a "Triv-ingo" gameboard.
- Guide kids to identify the animals, and then invite volunteers to tell one fact they know about an animal.
- Give each child 16 tokens.
- Invite a child to pull an egg from the basket, open it, and read the clue. (If the child is a pre-reader, point to each word as you whisper the clue in his ear, and then invite him to say it aloud.)
- Lead kids to guess the animal that matches the clue. If the group names multiple animals, take a vote.
- Reveal the answer and guide kids to place a token over that animal on their card. Then lead them to echo today's Bottom Line after you: **There's always more to discover about God's plan.**
- When a child connects four animals in a row either horizontally or vertically, they call out, "Bingo!"
- Continue playing as time remains.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Part of humility is always being willing and ready to learn and discover new things. Because there's always more to discover about so many things. There's always more to discover about animals, there's always more to discover about the world that God made, there's always more to discover about the things that you enjoy—like sports or dance or playing an instrument, and **there's always more to discover about God's plan!"**

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BOTTOM LINE

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BASIC TRUTH

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- Tips from Week 1.
- Guide the kids to sit in a circle and spread out a bit with their feet touching (or close to touching) each other's feet.
- Give a kid the ball and ask her to roll it to another kid, saying the first word of the verse as she rolls.
- That child will then roll the ball to someone else, saying the second word of the verse as he rolls.
- Continue until the kids say the entire verse. Be sure to provide plenty of help as needed!
- Unpack the phrase "value others more than yourselves." (Suggestion below.)
- Finally, guide kids to value others by calling another child's name, saying something they value about them (they're kind, helpful, willing to share, etc.), and then rolling the ball to that child.
- Continue until every child has been "valued."

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Philippians 2:3 tells us to: Value others more than yourselves (NIrV). What do you think it means to value others more than yourself? (It means to put others first; to think about other people before you think about yourself; to do kind things for other people; to think of other people as more important; etc.) Great ideas! This week look for ways to value others more than yourselves. When you do, you'll be like Jesus!"





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WHAT YOU DO:

- Guide kids to gather around you.
- Use the conversation below to guide kids into prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"God made our world SO amazing that there's always more to discover! There's always more to discover about the world that God made, about the things that we enjoy doing, and about the things that we learn in school. Even more, there's always more to discover about God's plan!

"What's something that you can learn more about this week? [Make It Personal] (Tell kids one thing that you'll seek to learn more about.) Great ideas! Let's pray and ask God to help us.

"Dear God, thank You for the gift of learning. Thank You that there's always more to discover about Your plan! Help us have attitudes that are ready to learn more about the world You made, about You, and about your Son, Jesus. We love You so much, Lord! You are amazing! Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, guide kids to tell parents today's Bottom Line: There's always more to discover about God's plan. Encourage—but don't force—kids to name one thing they'll seek to know more about.
